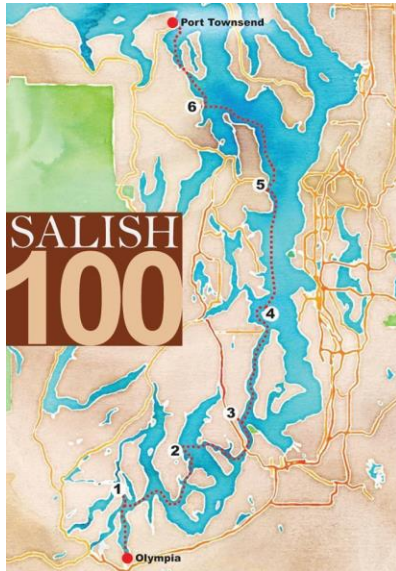

SALISH 100 Small-Boat Cruise to begin at Swantown Marina

Expect an increased amount of activity at Swantown Marina on Saturday, June 22 as the SALISH 100 Small-Boat Cruise departs for their weeklong sail to Port Townsend.

An expected 80 to 100 sailboats will launch at Swantown Marina and will lily-pad for seven days to Port Townsend. Power support boats will also be joining the journey.

Boats are expected to depart from Swantown Marina throughout Saturday morning. Expect heavier than normal traffic at the launch ramp and in the channel departing Swantown.

Their first overnight will take place at Henderson Inlet. Port of Olympia Harbor Patrol will check on the group periodically until they are out of County limits.
